1. T or F. Every person has his/her own guardian angel.
2. T or F. Old Testament prophets were sent forth to minister on behalf 1st century saints. How did they accomplish their mission?
3. T or F. Before the end of the first century, the Lord of glory was sent forth to minister on behalf of all those who would reap eternal life
4. T or F. Before the end of the first century, superhuman agents called angels were sent from God for the benefit of all who shall inherit salvation.
5. T or F. Everything that angels once did which is recorded in the Old and New Testament, they now do comparable activities for God's children today.
6. T or F. [note: Though this is not a trick question, readers need to play close attention to the wording.] In the song entitled, "Count Your Many Blessings," it says, "count your many blessings, angels will attend, help and comfort give you to your journey's end." If angels do not attend or give us comfort, then this is error and we must not sing it.
7. [read questions 6 and 7 together] In the song "Angels Are Singing," it states that angels are singing redemption's sweet song. Is this a reference to merely human messengers?
8. In the song "Angels Are Singing," in the third verse it reads, "soon we shall join the angels so fair." Are the angels of this song referring to human or superhuman beings?
 - a. Is it right to say angels sing? Yes.
 - b. Is it right to say angels sing "redemptions sweet song"? Yes.
 - c. Do angels praise God for His redemption? Can they sing these same praises?
 - d. What passage(s) would you use to verify these things?
